Player Profile: Gary Rose

Gary is a relatively new member of the Vets having joined us 4 years ago. He has taken a keen interest in what we do as a group and he put his hand up to join the committee last year, to which he has brought some fresh ideas and has become a valued member.



He was born in UK, back in 1956 and the family migrated to Australia at the end of 1959 as part of the 10 pound Poms program, arriving in the antipodes in 1960. He grew up in Canberra and at the ripe old age of 15, decided he wanted to join the Navy. He completed 20 years of service and reached the rank of Chief Petty Officer. He trained as a Gunner and transferred to the military police and was the Master at Arms on many of the ships in which he served. In 1992 he settled in Brisbane with his family and in 1996 Joined the Qld public service and was employed as a vessel traffic operator for the commercial movement of ships within the port of Brisbane and retired in December 2015. He started playing golf in 1981 playing in Sydney at Fox Hills, Ryde/Parramatta and later joined Redland Bay and then Pacific golf club in Brisbane. Rules of the Week

After the last newsletter, I was asked when the new rules for Seniors were coming into effect? I answered, tongue-in-cheek, that some of our guys have already adopted them!

Back to the real stuff..

Relief in a bunker.

Because a bunker is a hazard, the Rules for playing from a bunker are similar to the Rules for playing from a water hazard. The main differences are encountered when taking relief from immovable obstructions, abnormal ground conditions and under the unplayable ball Rule (Rule 28).

Movable Obstructions: Rule 24-1

A movable obstruction can be removed from any part of the course, including a bunker or water hazard. Movable obstructions are artificial objects such as rakes or drink cans which can be moved without unreasonable effort, without unduly delaying play and without causing damage. CTHGC has a local rule allowing for the removal of stones in bunkers, without penalty!
